This attachment is applicable to any Singer Family Machine.

Anyone who can use a sewing machine can do machine darning in household napery, which will be infinitely superior in appearance and will wear and wash better than hand darning.

A "SINGER" darn when washed and laundered is barely discernible.

The method of darning by machine is extremely simple, and will be readily explained at any Singer Shop.

The only special fittings required for the work are a wooden darning hoop, a feed cover plate, and the small Spring Presser No. 86496, above referred to, which is fitted to the machine in place of the ordinary needle clamp.

Figure 1 shews a Singer Sewing Machine fitted for darning.

Figure 2 shews the method of working.

Figure 3 is a photographic reproduction of a finished darn before being laundered. When laundered the darn would be practically invisible.

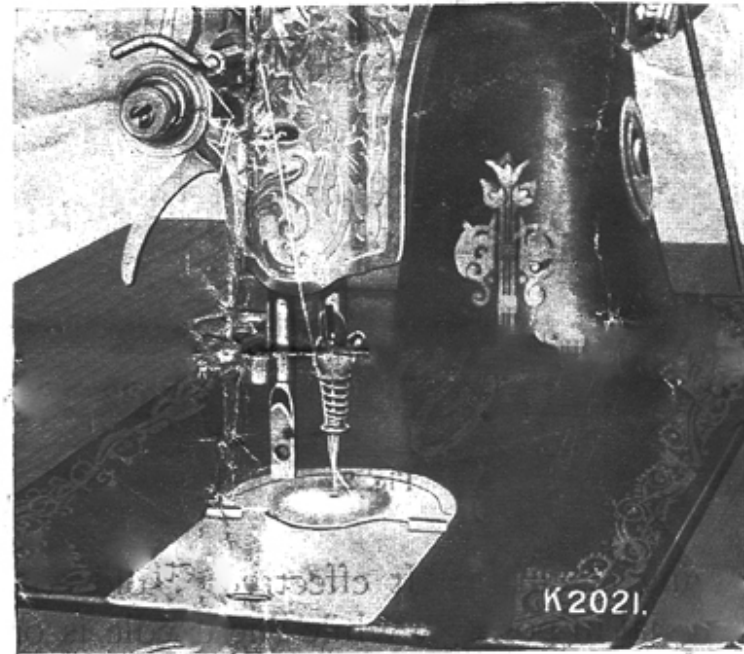
